2 Corinthians 6 and 7

2 Corinthians 6:1-10

Paul explains that we should not take God's grace and mercy for granted. We cannot think that God owes us anything and forget to be grateful. Paul gives us a list of graces that point to how God's grace covers us.

Where do we see ourselves in the list?

2 Corinthians 6:11-13

Paul asks the Corinthians to open their minds like children. Children love openly and freely until an incident happens to cause their worldview to change. Even when something hurtful happens, often children are quick to forgive.

What is so special about how children see the world?

2 Corinthians 6:14-18

Belial is another name for God's enemy, Satan. If we are walking with God, then we cannot walk with God's enemy.

How do we keep separate and still evangelize?

2 Corinthians 7:1

Paul states that we must be holy.

How do we cleanse ourselves in body and spirit?

2 Corinthians 7:2-4

Paul points to the sin but he does not condemn the sinner. God loves the sinner but does not want anyone to continue in sin

How can we mirror that behavior in today's outreach to the unsaved and in-reach to church members?

2 Corinthians 7:5-16

Paul discusses the impact of a prior letter that addressed an issue in the church body at Corinth. He realizes that it was hurtful but necessary.

What do we learn about correcting bad behavior?

Titus is a great help to Paul. Paul realizes the importance of Titus and makes certain that the church at Corinth is aware of the contributions that Titus makes to the ministry.
